We are launching **School: by Design** in our community and we are looking for a public educational institution, school or after-school program to collaborate with. The program focuses on working with low-income, underserved high school youth, although this is not a prerequisite. The initiative is designed to make participation easy for you. We'll do most of the work. Here is a list of what we are looking for in a partner:

- » Supervision of the students by a faculty member or administrator from your organization.
- » An administration supportive of participation.
- » A minimum eight-week commitment.
- » Work with us to develop a work plan and timeline for the project.
- » Be willing to collaborate with us and other local experts for support, coaching and sharing of best practices during the life of the project.
- » Allow youth work to be exhibited locally, online and/or globally.

In addition: Projects will be eligible for a cash prize to fund the implementation of an idea within the school. All participating organizations will be featured in any promotion that we do for the project and on the *Design Ignites Change* website.
